1. What do we know about Joseph?

2. Asking Pilate for Jesus' body is a bold step. It defies his peers and is bold considering Pilate's power. Why do you think Joseph asks for Jesus' body?

3. Who else is present?

4. What do they do?

5. If you were Joseph or the women, what do you think you'd be thinking at this point?

Luke 24:13-35

1. Where are the men going and what are they talking about?

2. When Jesus joins them, why don't they recognize Him?

3. The men are surprised when Jesus asks what they're talking about...why do you think so?

4. When they summarized for Jesus what happened, how did they describe it? See verses 19-24.

5. How does Jesus reprimand them?

6. After convincing Him to stay, Jesus is briefly revealed to them for who He is before disappearing. What is the men's response?

7. If you were the men on the Emma's road, how would you feel after this encounter?

Luke 9:23

1. How does this passage instruct us to live like Simon did?

2. What do you think it means to deny yourself and follow Jesus?

1 Peter 3:15-16

1. How is this passage related to how Joseph of Arimathea acted?

2. How can we prepare ourselves to give the reason for our hope in Christ?

Acts 10:40-42

1. How is this passage related to the men who talked with Jesus on the Emmaus Road?
